

Again if you are unaware of why we are looking at a new venue: it relates to the Art's Club (our current landlord) having a reluctance for us to truly share the building we currently use by having somewhere to store the clubs growing list of equipment, and imposing an increased rental cost this year.

In short the dealings that we have had with the Committee of the Arts Club recently have left the HBPS Committee feeling like the current meeting rooms are not the best long term location for our Club.

The meeting rooms where we will hold the 27th August meeting are larger, warmer, have a storage space for us to use, and have facilities that should make our meetings more comfortable and enjoyable.

The use of this location on a longer term basis is obviously a matter for the agreement of the Club members as a whole, but I am optimistic that this space will work better for us than our current location.

That said if anyone has any immediate misgivings about the change in location of the meeting then please let me know ASAP and I will try to resolve them.

Otherwise I hope you can attend on the 27th August at 5 Devonshire Place, Taradale.
